#### **Meeting Overview**

#### Thursday, February 28th

The 2019 program will open with the prestigious **Pediatric Leadership Development Program's (PLDP)** conference. The fellowship program aims to help develop the next generation of pediatric chairs in North America, ensuring that they will be well poised to lead our profession through the rapidly changing environment of academic medicine and health care in general.

This program is open to invited seventh and eight Cohort PLDP scholars, mentors, and committee/board members and does not include membership at large.

We will also be holding a workshop for New Chairs during the 2019 meeting on Thursday; special registration is required.

This year's meeting includes a session for the **Pediatric Scientist Development Program (PSDP)** and the **Canadian Child Health Clinician Scientist Program (CCHCSP)** trainees who will attend career development workshops. The PSDP operates under the aegis of AMSPDC. PSDP and CCHCSP enable pediatric fellows to undergo intensive research training with highly successful mentors in renowned research programs.

A combined reception and dinner for the PLDP participants, PSDP fellows and members of the Steering and Evaluation Committee, as well as New Chair workshop attendees and speakers, will conclude the day's events.

#### Friday, March 1st

AMSPDC members interested in hearing new and exciting research, and chairs and residents invited to participate in the **Frontiers in Science (FIS)** program will want to arrive in time for presentations by third-year PSDP fellows. Residents contemplating careers in research find these presentations particularly exciting because they see first-hand how PSDP training develops young pediatric physician-scientists.

The **Women's Chair Luncheon** will take place at 12:30pm at an offsite restaurant. If you did not previously register to attend, but would like to, please see the registration desk.

FIS continues with an afternoon session devoted to research presented by faculty from different institutions. These presentations update chairs on new work that will affect us as academicians and gives PSDP fellows a chance to see other research horizons. Those invited to speak are chosen not only for their science but also for their ability to tell the story.

The FIS/PSDP program closes with posters presented by second-year PSDP fellows and CCHCSP fellows; scientific interchange with AMSPDC members and residents is a high point. The evening concludes with a dinner that brings together PSDP fellows, FIS Residents, and their sponsoring AMSPDC chairs.

#### Saturday, March 2nd

With the exception of the AMSPDC Women's Chair Luncheon held Friday, this will be the first day of the AMSPDC meeting and plenary session. Saturday morning begins with an open networking breakfast with Dr. Diana Bianchi, designed to allow for an open dialogue between chairs and Dr. Bianchi.

Session one, "Substance Use Disorder Across the Pediatric Continuum", includes two talks. The first, presented by Dr. Stephen Patrick, is entitled "Improving Outcomes for Opioid-Exposed Infants" and the second, presented by Dr. Sharon Levy, is entitled "The Opioid Epidemic and Youth". The session is moderated by Dr. Bob Vinci.

After session one, we will be joined by the Association of Administrators in Academic Pediatrics (AAAP). The remainder of the day will be a joint session with AAAP members and is a tremendous opportunity to learn from, and network with their membership.

The second morning session will begin with Dr. Judy Aschner (FOPO Chair) providing a brief update on the Federation of Pediatric Organizations' (FOPO) recent initiatives of ensuring all kids get counted in the 2020 census. We will then be joined by three representatives from the American Board of Pediatrics (ABP), American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and Children's Hospital Association (CHA). Each representative will give a brief organizational update before opening up for a robust discussion between our panelists and audience members. Panelists include: Mr. Mark Del Monte of the American Academy of Pediatrics (moderated by Dr. John Barnard), Mr. Mark Wietecha of Children's Hospital Association (moderated by Dr. Scott Rivkees), and Dr. David Nichols of the American Board of Pediatrics (moderated by Dr. Judy Schaechter). The group will then break for a networking lunch.

After lunch, all will convene for the afternoon sessions, which will begin with our Keynote Address given by Ms. Johnese Spisso. Ms. Spisso will be addressing trends and issues in healthcare, AMC and pediatric finances in her talk entitled "Innovation in Children's Healthcare". Her session will be moderated by Dr. Sherin Devaskar.

In the second afternoon session, we will cover two topics; Key Principles in Clinical Effort Definitions and Key Principles in Compensation Planning. Dr. Doug Carlson from AMSPDC, will begin by providing an overview of Key Principles in Compensation Planning, followed by Ms. Melody Altman from AAAP, providing an overview of Key Principles in Clinical Effort Definitions. Each table will have a set of questions relating to the two topics along with a pre-determined scribe. Scribes consist of both AMSPDC and AAAP members. Tables will breakout and have meaningful discussion after each speaker presents. The session will culminate with each table summarizing their conversation and having Q&A discussion.

The day's program will conclude with the AMSPDC Business Meeting (AMSPDC members only) led by Dr. Michael Artman. The evening will include a social networking reception with fellow chairs and AAAP members.

#### Sunday, March 3rd

Sunday morning will begin with a working breakfast, facilitated by both Dr. Brian Pate and Dr. Gabriel Haddad. The joint breakfast is intended to create meaningful discussion around how we can have effective collaboration between small and large departments. Newly appointed FIS Chair, Dr. Wade Clapp, and PSDP Program Director, Sallie Permar, will then join us to present and discuss the strategic planning efforts and future of both the FIS and PSDP programs.

The final plenary is a panel discussion moderated by Dr. John Barnard, Dr. Joseph St. Geme, III and Dr. Robert Vinci. The topic of discussion will be Quality Improvement in academic, clinical and research realms. The panelists include: Dr. Ron Keren, Dr. Carole Lannon and Dr. Katherine Poehling.

Dr. Sherin Devaskar will conclude the meeting with the President's Closing Remarks.
